Reason:	For 2011, the total number of students graduating within 150% of time is 60. For 2012, the total number of students graduating within 150% is 64. Although the count of students graduating from each cohort are similar within 150%, the starting bachelors degree-seeking cohorts are noticeably different. For 2011, the bachelors degree seeking cohort is 275. For 2012, it is 190. Therefore from 2011 to 2012, there is a 30.9% decrease in the total FTFTF bachelors degree-seeking cohorts at WVUIT from 2011 to 2012.
